“Humanitas” of Switzerland and **“NACSEARelief”** are humbly proud of the dedicated people making such undertakings happen.





Acmonan School Building Project Accomplishment and Turnover Ceremony

The Department of Education formally accepted the two classroom buildings, Faculty Building, 90-armchairs, 2-rooms toilet, 2-handwash areas and 1-water reservoir on May 29, 2019 donated by **NACSEARelief** with the aid of **NAK Humanitas, Switzerland**.

In a simple turn over ceremony held at the grounds of the new Acmonan Elementary School Kafok Extension, the symbolic key was accepted by Department of Education (DepEd) School Division Superintendent, **Mr. Isagani S. De La Cruz, CESO V**, from NACSEA Relief representative, Ms. Mabelle Bagtas in the presence of **Hon Mayor, Reynaldo S. Tamayo, Barangay Captain Cawade T. Piang Jr.**, School head, **Ms. Edna Perez**, the guests, teachers, parents, and learners.

In her acceptance speech, Ms. Edna Perez, School Head, in behalf of the Department of Education, expressed her gratitude to **NACSEA Relief President, Mr. Urs Hebeisen** and to the donor, **NAK Humanitas of Switzerland** for their great support and make their dream of having a new school building a reality. She also thanked everyone who have come and celebrate the special occasion for the turnover ceremony of the new school building project.

The project is a testimony or proof of a strong conviction that became a reality through concerted actions, the conviction that the children need a good environment to learn many things in the world for their bright future, and the reality that is the completion of this new and solid school building.





The teaching staff extended their great appreciation as well to NACSEARelief for its generosity and help change the situation of the makeshift school room and temporary faculty shelter in Kafok for more than 3-years. Reminiscing what they all experienced during the past years, are hardships as they all look back how they have to fight and secure school materials from the effect of bad weather due dripping roofs and walls due strong rain and winds, ensuring safety of learners due muddy and dirt floors, and absenteeism as children have to walk 2.5 long hours just to attend classes.

They promised to extend their hands as stewards that will pilot in the maintenance and safeguarding the property to maximize its full potential and utilization capacity. The new school building will provide learners a conducive space for learning and can now concentrate more of their study, be inspired to study harder and reach their highest potential

Above all, the teaching staff and the community are with high hopes that the school facilities will serve as an instrument that will encourage learners to attend school every day, to develop competencies that they can use in the near future to effect progress not only for themselves but for their respective families and communities.

More than 100 pupils benefited the project.

Rehabilitation and Relocation of Barangay Dalama, Tubod Lanao del Norte

ALPS (Aid Line Philippines Swiss), **IKP** (Island Kids of the Philippines), the **Philippine Red-Cross** and **NACSEARelief** all joined to realize the rebuilding of homes. **ALPS/NACSEARelief** part was handled by **Thomas Kellenberger** of IKP, our representative in the area, who supervised the proper use of 1000 sacks of cement donated.

Projects like this also encourage the process of healing for the affected families. From being helpless victims during the devastating calamity to becoming survivors, who are finally able to rebuild their homes. We thank all supporters and donors.

Typhoon Vinta made its first landfall in Cateel, Davao Oriental Province December 21, 2017, on the east coast of the southern island of Mindanao. the deadly tropical cyclone left behind death and devastation, causing several cities and municipalities to declare a state of calamity.





How little accomplishes much to save 4 hectares destroyed farmland

In our annual report 2018 on page Typhon Ompong, we read that this storm which left behind 14,3 Billion Pesos in agricultural damage.

True to our “sea star strategy” we went beyond relief activity and really wanted to make a change and help to rebuild livelihood. One has to understand besides all the personal hardship and loss at time of typhoon the real problem lays in the destruction of the field, the harvest, Re-cropping is what has to be addressed.

We monitor the effects of our work. Here are the mathematics.

NACSEARelief invested PHP 140 000 in new seedlings

Result: A new harvest of 381 sacks of rice

Laborers got 102 sacks of rice

Remaining: 279 sacks were sold at PHP 15/kg

Revenue: PHP 209 250

Expenses: 110 000 (fertilizer PHP 27'500 per hectare

Income: PHP 99 250

Isabela and Cagayan farmers reported that their rice harvest for this season is in a great measure of 100% thus everyone was very glad and grateful that food for their families, expenses for schooling of their children as well as re-cropping is now secured.

Favourable weather, the very good irrigation system provided by Magat Dam and most importantly, the rice seedling inbred, and hybrid varieties received from NACSEA Relief is of very good quality and well received just in time for their planting season according to the beneficiaries.

The farmers extended once again their deepest thanks to NACSEA Relief and its donor not only for the aid but also for free training of new rice technology prompting them gained net income as much as P99,250.00.

Relief Operation “Earthquake” in Mindanao

Teams of **NACSEARelief** under the leadership of **DE Freddie Nuyad** reaching out to the affected population in Davao del Sur. The help reached into 50 NAC families and additional 20 neighbours. At the same time also our partner organization IKP in Cagayan de Oro, headed by **Thomas Kellenberger** has been in North Cotabato with 600 needy families on the agenda (out of over 4000 victim-families identified) **NAK-humanitas of Switzerland** is supporting the project.

NACSEARelief Meeting with task force “earthquake” was held in Tagum, Saturday 30 November 2019

A team of 7 under leadership of Ramil Saomines and Antero Patilla undertook 3 trips to affected areas in North Cotabato and Davao del Sur on 6th and 7th November. Food packages were distributed to some 200 families. This is just our action by BoT member Freddie Nuyad and does not include the reach out we undertook from Cagayan de Oro with IKP. A drop into the ocean.

Our team was apprehended by military and ordered to surrender all food deliveries to official stock yards. It was negotiated however that we are reaching out to a certain target group (church) and were given passage.

The situation is still very critical. Problem is the Military has cordoned off the whole area and there is no access due to apparent high risks of earth movements. Thousands of people have been evacuated with no real place to go. We learned that authorities are looking for safe resettlement ground but there is nothing known yet where that could be.

There is great concern about the area of the mountains in Abad Santos from where no news was received. Very remote regions. Freddie Nuyad and Mercurio Nuyad will try to get info's through the network of local pastors. Being a School Principal, he will also try to cooperate with the network of the local schoolteachers.



We are planning further food deliveries but then eventually the main task coming towards us are rehabilitation and rebuilding. It is just too early to start with such a project since relocation plans are not finalized yet by the authorities.

As of November 24th, National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) said 23 people died, 563 people were injured, and 11 people have been missing in the October quakes. It is also reported that around 320,000 people have been affected and more than 180,000 people have been displaced.

Earthquakes and two typhoons have caused more sadness and the expectation to celebrate and have a joyful family time together was for many families just a dream. It's exactly in such times when help is most welcome and brings comfort so much needed. Typhoon "tiso" has caused much damage in the areas of Mindoro and Bicol and **NACSEARelief** reached out to 76-families in Mindoro and 253-families in the Bicol region in delivering food packages.

Such relief activity is always just a first step, what we must look into it is repairing of houses and rebuilding of agriculture. Calamity reports we also received from Leyte and further action is under process. Thank you for your support and cooperation for our beloved Filipino people and goodwill towards our country.

Yet to help and solve every problem is an impossible task no one can fulfil. Committed and specialized services worldwide are much needed.

A reminder of World Food Day

People's concern for the world climate, combined with calls for taking responsibility for the environment are currently on everyone's lips. World Food Day also plays into this concern. It is observed every year on 16 October and draws attention to the fact that millions of people suffer from malnutrition.

The Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations (FAO) estimates that more than 820 million people worldwide suffer from hunger, food insecurity, and malnutrition. That is one in nine people, most of them in Asia and Africa. Every year about 9 million people die of starvation; that is more than the combined deaths from HIV/Aids, malaria, and tuberculosis.

As always, those most at risk are children and women. UNICEF, the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund, reports that one in three children under five is ill and not growing well because of malnutrition—a total of some 200 million children.

"Let's not forget the many millions of people who go hungry every day! Anyone who is grateful for what God gives him will not simply be indifferent to the suffering of others," says District Apostle Michael Ehrich from the District Church Southern Germany. The Church's own charity, human aktiv, regularly provides for people suffering from hunger-related causes at home and abroad.

NACSEARelief negotiates usufruct agreements with local government or NGO’s to put the property to public use, social or charity. Thereby a good purpose is maintained without changing the ownership.

The projects are then accompanied and where necessary also supported.



OUTLOOK TWENTY-TWENTY




Help to rehabilitate homes affected by the typhoons “Ursula” and “Tisoy” is ongoing. The calamity of the earthquakes in Mindanao is probably not over and closely monitored. The eruption of Taal volcano has brought about anxiety and fear but material need is well taken care of by community and government.

To support Youth and children in schooling is again on our priority agenda. We are also aware that alertness for natural disaster is a need. Again, the real needy are usual not in towns and along the highways but far from urbanization, in mountains and on islands.
