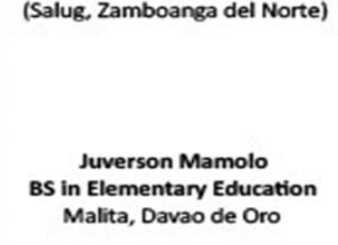

Here and there local and personal calamities are reported to us and even also we cannot solve all personal problems, assistance is always a welcome help.



ANNUAL MEETING IN DUMAGUETE

The tradition to have the annual meeting of the board of Trustees together with a meeting with the Apostles Council of the New Apostolic Church of the Philippines was continued also this year. This time we met in Dumaguete. The meeting was hosted by our Board member **Siegfred Catan**.

2022 activities were reviewed and discussed. The board reckoned with the fact that the Philippines ranks worldwide first in vulnerability for natural di-

sasters such as earthquakes and typhoons resulting in destructions of livelihood and even human lives.

The president expressed his satisfaction that Administration Expenses amount only to 1,2 %. 64 % of expenses were in Disaster Relief, 11,9 % in Community projects while Educational Support amounted to 21,5 %.

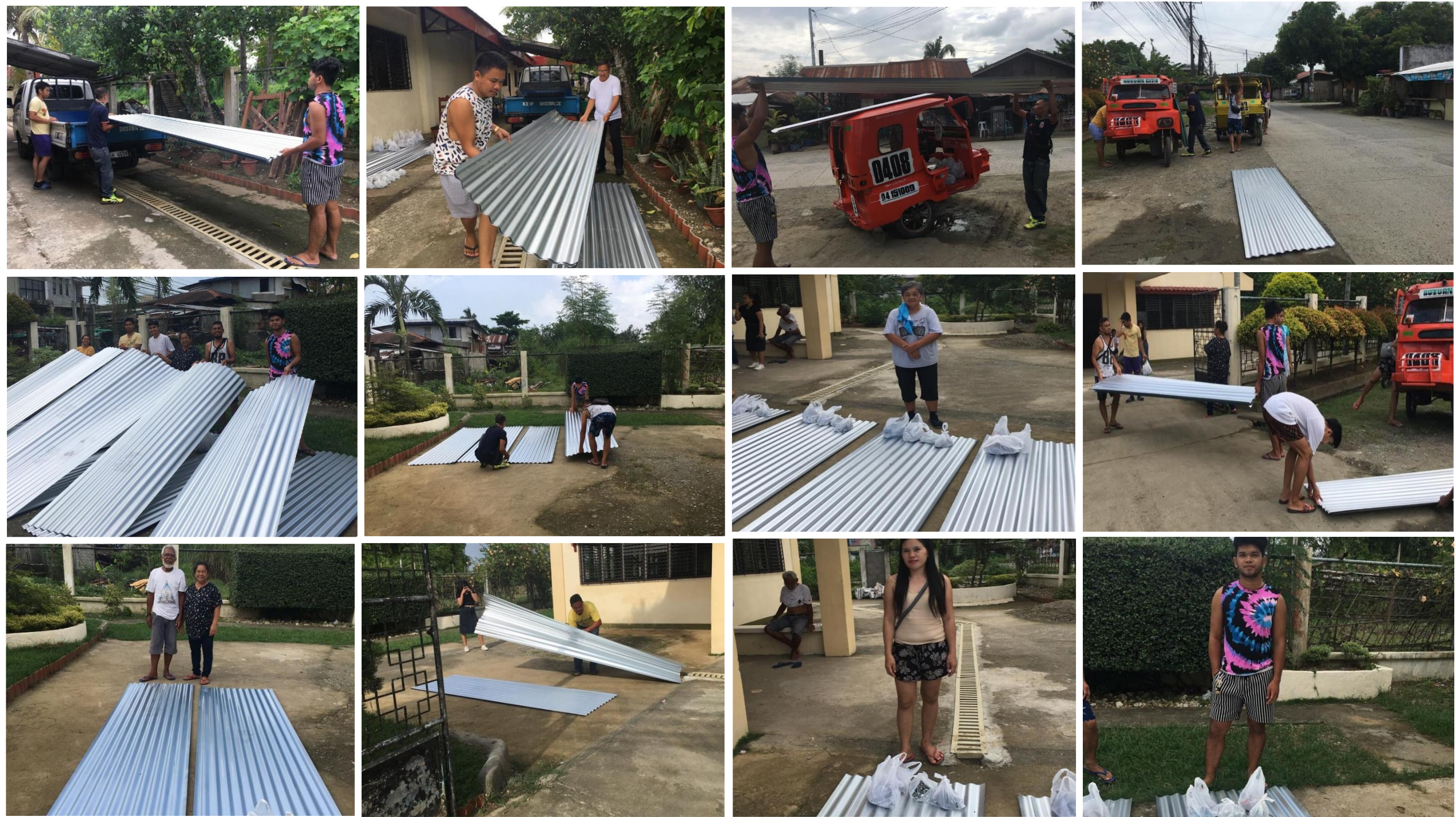

Finally on **21st September** the one classroom structure could be given to its purpose by turning it over to DepEd.



De-commissioned Church



Missionary history tells us that congregations come and go. Therefore, it can happen that due to demographic development church buildings have become obsolete and NACSEARelief, Inc. is commissioned to look for alternative purpose to give a building a new social meaning.

Such projects we have in Famy/Laguna, Binan/Laguna, Lutopan/Cebu and Asan Sur/ Panga-

sinan. "Always with you" a NGO connected with "Association Alouette" (France) and "Chance for Growth" (Germany) in support of their mission of love and compassion to the Filipino children and youth through the gift of education, signed a MoA (Memorandum of Agreement) for the use of the NAC property in Asan Sur, Pangasinan.



Ten Years After “Yolanda”

On November 8, 2013 Super Typhoon Hayan, codenamed in the Philippines “Yolanda” became the deadliest natural disaster in the known history of the Philippines.

It was then our biggest ever undertaking of relief and reconstruction.

A delegation of NACSEARelief visited Leyte to have a look and feel the situation, after all HUMANITAS and NAK-karitativ commissioned us with unprecedented investment.

Our report was then put on line. Recognition and thankfulness yes, but many questions remain open.



Food Program and Agricultural Teaching

We have also supported this year our friends in Bohol, **STEPS Mission** in Panglao, led by Swiss **Evelin Hotz Gamonez**. Their vision is to give people a chance to lead better lives through education and training and we supported their Food- and Agricultural Program. While the food

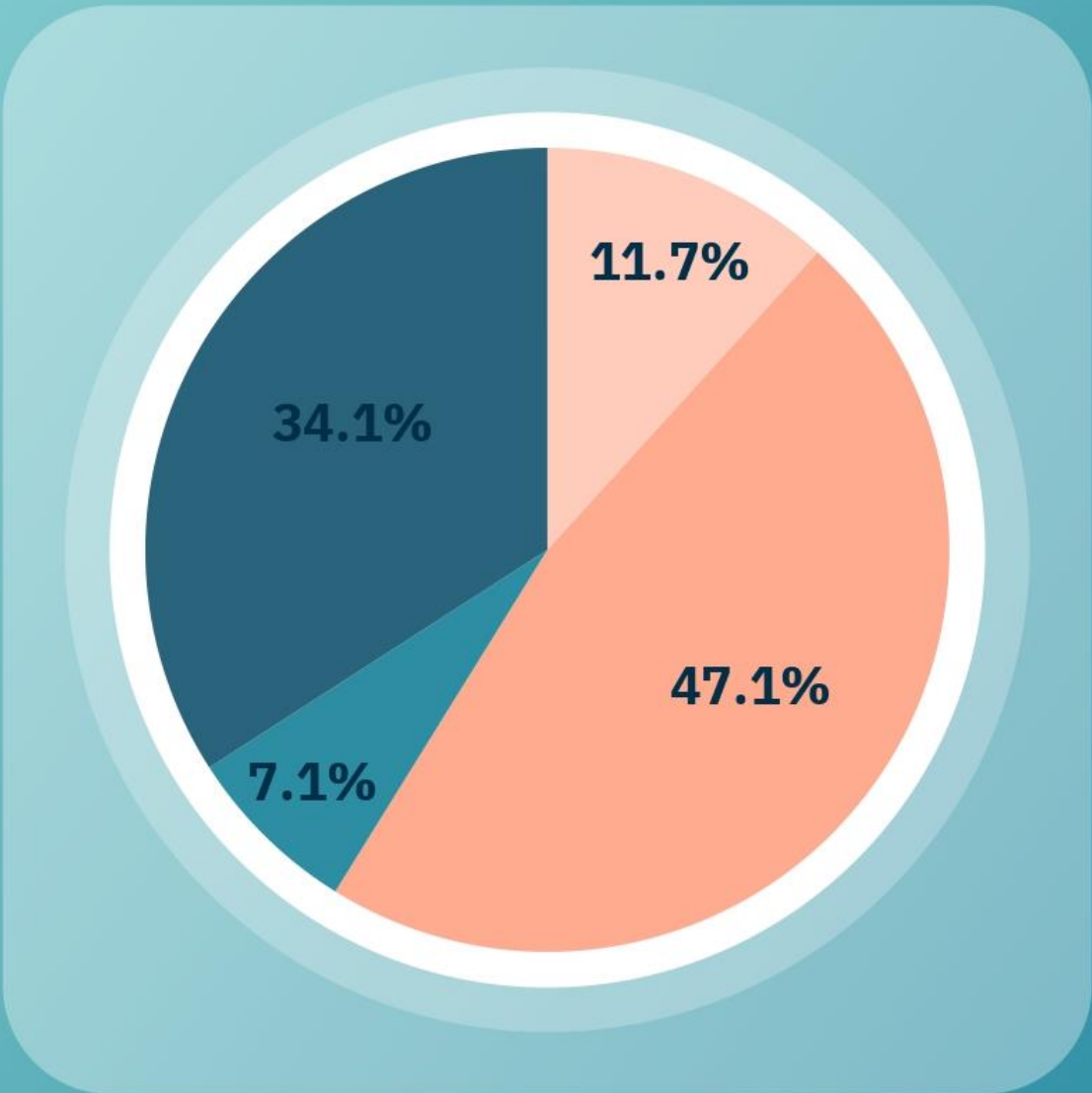
program is benefiting a home for abandoned and abused children and babies the agricultural program is focused on ecological, genetic free farming such as producing biological fertilizer and insecticides.

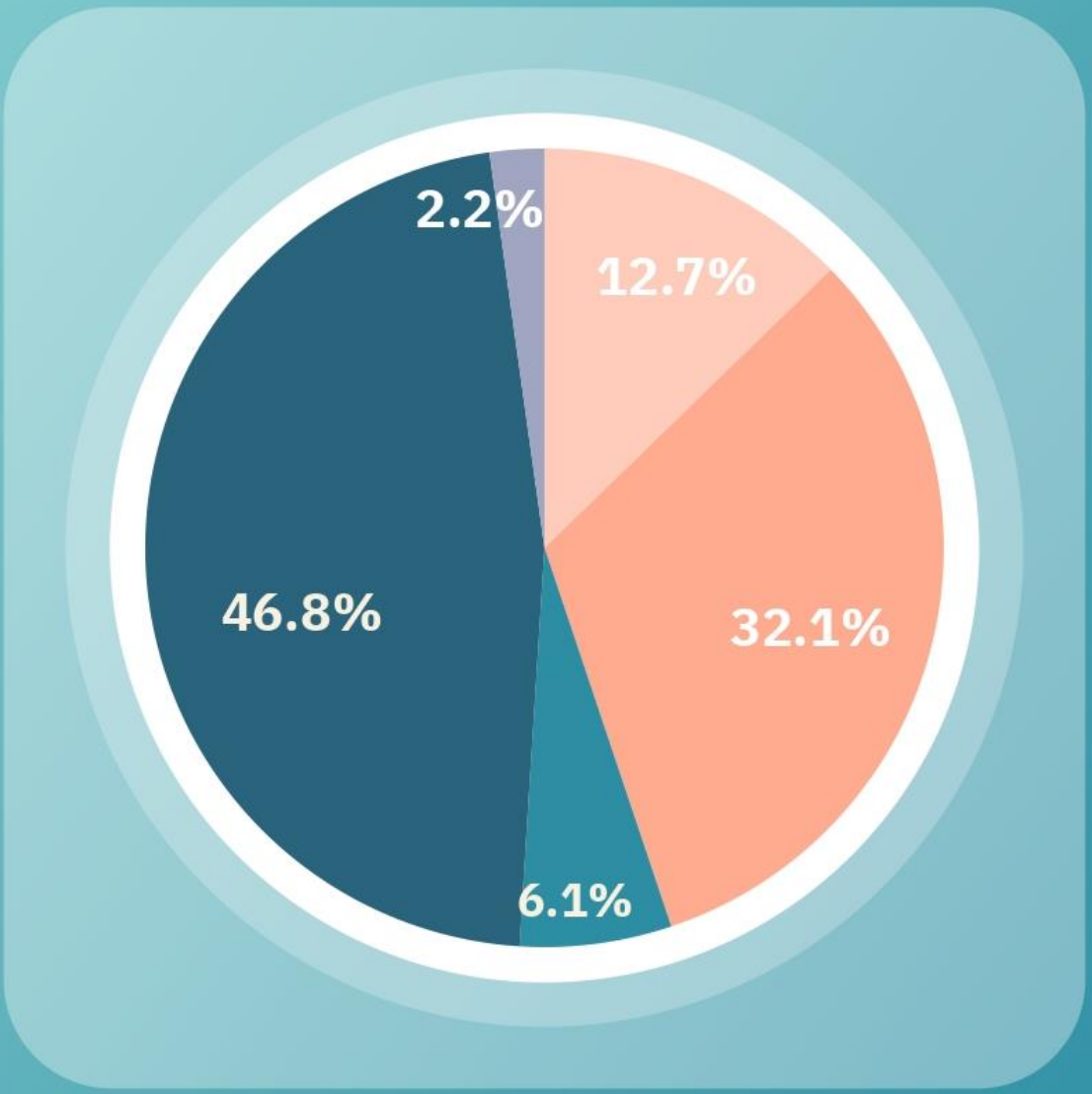

Classrooms Projects are planned in South Cotabato and Iloilo.

MoU was signed with NACforeign-extension from Canada for the financing of one classroom in Kiabog, Davao Occidental in 2024.

The Scholarship program will be further developed, and we hope to keep the target of 100 students. Our donors have suggested to provide also coaching and guidance besides just support. This is challenging in view of the spread out of our beneficiaries.

We plan to emphasize on sustainability of our work and projects. As guideline serve the 17 Sustainability Goals of the United Nations.

Whether more investment in long-term durability of rebuilding rather than mere relief and assistance in calamity is feasible is under study but is in the end a matter of financial resources.
