Renewal of Memorandum of Agreements



January 17, 2024 – As previously reported, some church buildings are no longer in pastoral use. NACSEARelief looks for ways to repurpose these facilities for the benefit of the public.

Mrs. Lourdes Dimaguila of GoForward Foundation in Biñan, along with Councillor Theodoro Vale from Barangay Damayan in Famy, visited our office to renew their respective Memoranda of Agreement.

"The church is part of society and thus it is a privilege to put such valuable properties at disposal for the benefit of community. Also this belongs to accountability" the President of NACSEARelief stated. Also present at the meeting was Apostle Samuel Tansahtikno, the current District Rector of the New Apostolic Church Philippines.

While programs in Biñan focus on persons with disabilities, initiatives in Famy primarily support youth beneficiaries through Sanguniang Kabataan.

Restoring and repurposing houses of worship is an established tool to give it a new lease on life that benefits the community.











New Classroom Project in Davao Occidental

January 19, 2024 – The work has begun on a classroom building in Kiabog, Davao Occidental, Philippines, sponsored by a Canadian charity. This facility will support the Mobile Alternative Learning System (ALS) by the Department of Education, to benefit the local children of the area by providing a place to learn.

Our frontliner, Mabelle Bagtas, is on-site to meet with the community, representatives from DepEd, builders, and the Barrio Captain to plan the work which is set to commence by the end of January. The great challenge to face is the haulage and delivery of materials up to the school site yet the community is willing to help and will use their horses to bring the materials up the mountain difficult trek of Kiabog site.

The team had to brave adverse weather conditions and undertake a strenuous trek to reach this remote location, highlighting the dedication behind this important project.







Disasters Relief in Mindanao: Be a Bearer of Light to People in Need

February 14, 2024 - While Valentine's Day is widely celebrated in urban areas, 1.6 million people in the provinces of Davao de Oro and Davao Oriental are suffering from the devastating effects of floods and landslides. Reports of calamity have also been received from Agusan. According to local media, tens of thousands have fled their homes, seeking refuge in evacuation centers, schools, and churches yet just to face the next challenge: hunger.

It rains and that causes floods even landslides and in an instant - homes, food supplies, and crops are destroyed or totally gone. One who does not experience that can hardly imagine what a stress and anxiety this means for families and communities.

At NACSEARelief, we always feel sad how little one can do. Yet, every act of outreach makes a difference, and we are grateful that, thanks to private donors in Germany, we have been able to assist over 100 families so far.







SWISS FESTIVAL RAISING FUNDS FOR FLOOD VICTIMS

February 20, 2024 - The Swiss Ambassador visited Merville today to attend a cultural event at LeDelice, which is sponsoring NACSEARelief's flood relief program in Mindanao.

A group of Swiss nationals from the city of Basel gathered for a live broadcast of the world heritage-certified Basel Carnival. At exactly 4 AM Swiss time (11 AM Merville time), the Ambassador and 12 Swiss attendees from Basel witnessed the festival's official opening, known as "Morgestraich."

In keeping with tradition, LeDelice served flour soup, onion tarts, and cheese tarts to the guests.

Key officers from DepEd, Municipality of T'boli, Barangay Laconon, Military and other government officials who graced the event were all more than proud, grateful, fulfilled, and happy, knowing that the lives of more learners will surely change positively with the help of the new school facility. Freddie Nuyad of NACSEA Relief, who believes in the power of education in uplifting shared communities, that the organization had already turned over 5- school building projects to the grassroots communities in his area with building structures which were all according to DepEd standards ideal for the students' learning environment and spaces that will allow young people to flourish and learn. He encouraged the Motosom community to help take care and maintain of the upkeep the school facility.





SDS Efren Balala, in his acceptance speech and on behalf of DepEd, expressed thanks to the kind-hearted people particularly NACSEA Relief executives and donors NAC Philippines and especially to NACIInternational for their unwavering support to better education of unprivileged children in the far-flung areas.

Municipal Mayor, Hon Mayor Keo Dayle Tuan also expressed his great appreciation and commitment to all partners of NACSEA Relief to better the status of education. He further noted that this project will bridge the gaps and open wide array of chances and opportunities for T'boli children despite the challenges and difficulties which are multifactorial by nature.

Meanwhile, SB Committee Chair on Education, Hon. Councilor Kirk T. expressed elation with the inauguration of new school building, saying that good facilities and infrastructures are important in producing school outcomes. This would encourage good attendance to students as they would be inspired to go to school.

Mr. Gil Tongcaling, Principal In-charge/Principal III of DepEd, expressed great thankfulness to all stakeholders for their support to address the gaps in resources and facilities of schools in geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas and transform makeshift classrooms into an environment conducive for learning. He is confident that with the continuing support of private sectors and other stakeholders, education resource gaps can be further narrowed down.

Teacher Alfred also thanked the implementors who made the construction of the integrated school buildings possible. He assured that through this project, he will continue to deliver quality education for the students of Motosom in their new school.

The parents, teachers, and students were all very happy after the inauguration as they need not walk long kilometers anymore in going to school. 200-students will benefit from this project (*Mabelle Bagtas*, *Operations Manager NACSEARelief*).



This initiative has instilled a renewed sense of hope in the community and promises a brighter future for the education of their children. It will also enable students to attend classes regularly and concentrate on their studies without facing transportation challenges anymore.

With the support of Nak Humanitas Switzerland, 89-pupils who are presently enrolled in this school as well the 7-school teachers will benefit of the improvement of their facilities.

Accomplishment and dedication is envisioned for October.

August 7, 2024 - The El Niño phenomenon has significantly impacted agricultural production in the Soccksargen region home of the Tiboli tribe. Time is running out and we started with a first step, supporting 243smallholder farmers in 12-villages of the T'boli Municipality. With the assistance of the Department of Agriculture, we were able to also provide valuable guidance on best practices for farm management, ensuring the farmers are well-equipped to achieve a good harvest.





Additionally, the Local Government Units (LGUs) played a crucial role in the success of this initiative. They generously allowed us to utilize their facilities for the orderly distribution of resources. Their support was instrumental, especially given their own financial constraints. The LGUs have expressed their gratitude towards our NACSEA RELIEF management acknowledging that they lacked the necessary funds to provide the corn seed required for the planting season.




EDUCATION BEYOND BORDERS

For the longest time in history, education in the Philippines has played an essential role in building the backbone of society, its people, and leaders. Through education, the country molds economists, researchers, politicians, lawyers, teachers, and artists even church ministers. It is a cornerstone of national development, contributing to growth, social progress, and stability.







At NACSEARelief we share this vision. Over 28 Million Filipino learners are sharing classrooms in some 320,000 School Building but less than one third are in good condition. Due to demographic development there is also a shortage of classrooms especially in fare away areas.





With the help from abroad, mainly NAK-HUMANITAS Switzerland we are engaged in building and transferring of classrooms for over ten years. Usually in areas most needed, far away from urbanization. April 2014 the first 2 classrooms were turned over to its purpose in Compostela Valley then Davao del Norte. Many more followed, total 49 in Classrooms, some with faculty rooms and sanitary installations until the most recent project in Banate/ Iloilo.

"Much remains to be done" the secretary said. We are happy to be part of it and look forward to more projects.







PHASE 2 OF CORN SEEDS ASSISTANCE

Lake Sebu - 15th of November 2024. In a town-hallmeeting we distributed on behalf of NAK-karitativ Germany, corn seeds for the fields of 756 families.

Empowering Communities in Bohol and Beyond




